State vs. Federal Funds?

Services provided by N.C. BCCCP (e.g. CBE, mammogram, etc.) must be for women who are not receiving those services through other federally-funded programs (Title X Family Planning, Medicaid, Medicare, etc.).

Age	Asymptomatic	High Risk	Symptomatic
< 40	N/A	Age \geq 30 Federal	*Federal or State
40-49	State	*Federal or State	*Federal or State
50-64	**Federal or State	**Federal or State	**Federal or State
65-75	State	*Federal or State	*Federal or State

*No more than 25% of Federal funds may be used for **symptomatic** or **asymptomatic high-risk** women outside of the target population of 50 to 64 years of age. Prior authorization is required for use of these funds for asymptomatic patients ages 40 to 49.

** Use Federal funds first for this priority population.

Age	High Risk	Asymptomatic	Symptomatic
21-64	Federal or State	Federal or State	Federal or State
65 \pm	STOP screening unless following up an abnormal finding or history of cervical cancer and woman is ineligible to receive Medicare part B or cannot pay her premium to enroll in Medicare part B. May use Federal or State funds
